I hope this newsletter finds you well.

I hope you had the opportunity to attend one or more of the Bicentennial events that have been held throughout the year. Many thanks to the sponsors and volunteers responsible for bringing these events to us. Our final event of the year will be the Bicentennial Gala on December 7th. Please see the information contained within the newsletter for more details. I hope to see you there.

While we had hoped to begin the Hunts Road improvement project this year, we were faced with a slight setback. NJ DEP is now requiring an archaeological survey of the area to be repaired due to it being designated a historic district. We are adjusting, but the earliest the Hunts Road project will begin will not be until spring/summer of 2025 and is dependent on the survey results. Stay tuned!

The Henry Road resurfacing project was completed as expected earlier this year. And due to the delay of the Hunts Road project, the resurfacing of Sutton Road, a portion of Phillips Road and a portion Mackerley Road were bumped up and just completed.

Our DPW department was busy this summer with several projects throughout the town, including the installation of 5 new drainage basins and the repair of approximately 25 existing basins. They also converted one of the basketball court areas into a pickleball court.

Note: All dogs must have current rabies vaccination that does not expire prior to November 1, 2025 per NJ State Law in order to be issued a 2025 dog license.

#### Dog License 2025

All dogs 7 months of age and older must be licensed and all licenses are to be renewed by January 31, 2025. IF LICENSES ARE NOT RENEWED ON TIME A LATE FEE OF \$5.00 PER DOG PER MONTH WILL BE IMPOSED AFTER FEBRUARY 10TH.



Per State Law, a license cannot be issued if the current rabies vaccination expires before November 1, 2025. If you do not renew the license, a court complaint/summons will be issued. To renew and pay online or to obtain a new dog license please visit www.greentwp.com. All new dogs must be registered in person at Town Hall. # IMPORTANT MESSAGE about DOGS on Township Property



On June 22, 2022, the Township Committee adopted Ordinance 2022-08 permitting leashed dogs in EverGreen Park, EverGreen Trail, County Connector Trail and Papa Park. Pet waste receptacles with waste bags were installed for the convenience of removing waste. Recently it has been discovered that many owners are not cleaning up after their dog. In addition, dogs have been observed running around off leash. Please be aware that if the Ordinance is not followed, the privilege of allowing leashed dogs on Township properties will be removed. The Township is pleased to allow leashed dogs and ask that dog owners be conscientious and considerate by picking up after your dog and keeping them leashed for the protection of all.



Congratulations to Jim Kucharski and Pat DeClesis for winning the Bronze Medal in the team Corn Hole Competition at the NJ Senior Olympics!


Jim won Gold and Pat won the Bronze in the single Corn Hole Competition for their age groups also!



#### CELEBRATING THE BICENTENNIAL - 1824 - 2024

#### THE LAWRENCE LINE

This is a photograph of the 101-mile tree with Phil Insinga, on the land where he was raised.

Years ago, reading "The History of Green Township", by Thomas J. Beirne, I was intrigued by his mention of the Lawrence Line and the Ninety-nine-mile tree. I decided to do some research.

I learned that in March 1664, the King of England, granted to his brother James, the lands between the Connecticut and Delaware rivers. Brother James then granted the territory which lay between the Hudson and the Delaware rivers to his friends Sir George Carteret and Lord John Berkeley.

The land was called New Jersey after the Isle of Jersey, one of the Channel Islands and the ancestral home of Carteret.

The state was then divided into East and West Jersey. A division line was established, but it was not until 1743 that John Lawrence was commissioned to survey the line.

I located the general location of the Lawrence Line on the map of New Jersey from a Morris County History book.

Reading extracts from the original field-book notes of John Lawrence as he ran the survey for the partitionline through Sussex County indicate that the line ran through Green Township.

As John Lawrence surveyed the line from south to north, he marked his line using trees. He marked line-trees, side-trees, and mile-trees. As instructed, he marked and labeled mile-trees according to their distance from the starting point of the survey.

Searching through the Books of Division at the Sussex County Hall of Records, I located a survey from 1828 showing the location of the 99-mile tree.

I learned from the State Forest Fire Service in Franklin that they have a fire tower in Mount Olive called the 95-mile tree fire tower.

I located the Lawrence Line in Green Township by running a line through the point of the 99-mile tree, the point of the 95-mile forest fire station, and along the boundary line (a portion of the Lawrence Line) that separates Stillwater Township from Hampton Township.

The Lawrence Line in Green Township exists as the boundary line for many properties, and shows up as a distinct line on the township map

From James P. Snell's" History of Sussex and Warren Counties" we learn that Thomas Allen cut down the 100-mile tree that was a boundary marker on his 160 acres, because "he feared it might affect his title to part of his farm." The property now owned by the Kirby family (formally the Insinga Farm and the Hamilton Farm) is still intact as a 160-acre parcel.

Using a scale to measure one mile from the 99-mile point locates the 100-mile point on a corner of the 160-acre parcel on the Lawrence Line.

Using the same scale to measure two miles from the 99-mile point locates the 101-mile point at the intersection where a part of the Kirby Family Farm meets the Whittingham Wildlife Management Area. This point is also on the border line between Green and Fredon Townships just a short distance from the Andover Township line.

A survey from a mortgage document in the possession of Phil Insinga states, "Beginning at the beginning corner of the first tract at a stake and stones in the East and West Jersey line a corner of Samuel Hill's land thence along his line as the needle indicated in the year 1840 South forty degrees West sixteen chains to a large red oak tree, a corner of Samuel Hill's land."


Checking this location, I found an old oak tree. The circumference of the tree is 15'9" measured at four feet from the ground at the high side of the tree.

The notes of John Lawrence indicate that in 1743 on this spot stood "A White Oak ab't 12" diameter on the edge of a hill of limestone. The tree does sit on the edge of a hill of limestone, but I thought it is probably a Red or Scarlet Oak not a White Oak.

On November 12, 1999, I met with Ranger Jack Shuart of the New Jersey Forest Service, to examine the tree and attempt to determine the age with the use of an increment boring tool; and to make a positive identification of the type of oak. Ranger Shuart made several attempts to take a boring sample but was unsuccessful because the tree is hollow. The walls surrounding the cavity are only inches thick. The Ranger took leaf samples for identification purposes. He believes that this oak is a hybrid of two varieties of oak trees.

This tree now marks a corner of the Crown Tree Ranch.



#### EVERGREEN PARK BATHROOMS

The bathrooms at EverGreen Park will be closing in early December for the season. This closure prevents the pipes from freezing and is necessary for the protection of the systems. A temporary, handicap accessible bathroom will be available throughout the winter.

#### NO PARKING SNOW PLOWING/SHOVELING

There is **NO PARKING** on any road during snow storms, cars will be towed at owner's expense. There will be **NO** plowing, shoveling, or snow blowing of snow I**NTO** or **ACROSS** the roads. Please make sure all sidewalks on your property are cleared of snow within 24 hours of storm.

#### FIRE HYDRANTS

Ordinance 17-2.7.1 Removal of Snow Around Fire Hydrants

The owner, owners or lessees of any real property in the Township abutting any fire hydrant shall maintain the area within a five-foot radius of the perimeter of any such fire hydrant free of snow. The removal of snow shall be completed within 24 hours of daylight after the snow has formed or fallen or accumulated on or around any fire hydrant. On failure to perform the required clearance within the specified time frame, the Township, or any department thereof, may perform the clearance and bill the responsible party no more than \$75.
