MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK: Mr. Zschack noted the following matters:

NJLM - Requests to attend the New Jersey League of Municipalities convention in November in Atlantic City were distributed. Requests to attend were submitted by Mark Zschack, Jason Miller and Mike Rose. We will be making hotel arrangements for Mark Zschack and Jason Miller. Committeeman Rose secures and pays for his own travel. The Township covers only the cost of the convention registration.

Memorial Bench Program - An application was received to install a bench along the walking path at EverGreen Park. This will represent the sixth bench purchased since the inception of the bench program. If there are no objections a suitable location will be chosen with the intent to evenly space these rest areas.

Garbage Bid Results - The bid opening for solid waste and recycling services was held on June 12th. Blue Diamond was the lone bidder for both a three and five-year contract. The three-year bid amount is \$384,000.00 yearly and the five-year bid amount is \$360,000.00. (All tipping fees are covered by Green Township). The three-year proposal represents a 28% increase, and the five-year option is at 20%. This is good news as we were anticipating a much larger increase because five years there was a 77% increase. A tiered payment system was offered starting at \$336,000.00 and ending at \$384,000.00 but the CFO and I recommend payments at \$360,000.00 per year. The bid document is still under review and will be presented for consideration at the July 15th Township Committee meeting.

NJDOT Municipal Aid Project: Henry Road - This year's DOT project consists of the milling and paving of Henry Road with construction slated to commence on Thursday June 20th. This work is estimated to last four days and is scheduled to terminate on Tuesday, June 25th. The road will be closed during construction hours but always open to local traffic.

Municipal Vehicle - For many months we were having trouble with the lease of a township vehicle due to procurement guidelines. We requested help from Sean Canning, QPA, who has experience in such matters and is also having difficulty in this pursuit.

MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY:

Rose noticed construction on a new drainage culvert in front of the Airport Road property that has been under construction for many years. The Township Clerk will check into the approvals.

Rose asked if it was considered to hire a part-time DPW employee for summer help. The Township Clerk explained that it was considered during the hiring of the sixth DPW employee. Rose commented that it may be helpful to have an extra employee with the number of projects and the very short window to get them done. Mayor Phillips commented that the extra DPW employee was brought on once the mowing was brought back in-house. Mayor Phillips commented that there have also been several unexpected absenteeisms. Part-time seasonal help will be explored during budget time for next year.

DeYoung commented on the increasing number of 5K events, and it is a good thing that we developed a set of rules.

DeYoung commented that ParkRun is at EverGreen Park every Saturday morning. It is a very successful program.

Qarmout provided no report.

Mayor Phillips read the joint legislative resolution from the State of New Jersey Senate and the General Assembly. Mayor Phillips had the resolution framed to be proudly displayed in the municipal building.

Mayor Phillips also read the declaration from Congressman Tom Kean that was read for the congressional record on June 5, 2024. This will also be framed to be proudly displayed in the municipal building.

MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY: The Township Attorney had no matters for discussion.

MATTERS FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS: Not in attendance.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION #2: Mayor Phillips opened the meeting for public comments. Josephine Fracasso commented on the recent over the rail mowing. The mower is not cutting in deep as much as they have in the past. Josephine commented that opening Hibler Road for the detour would be a mistake. Trucks are still speeding through although a lot less with the proper signage.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules commonly referred to as the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulation at N.J.A.C. 5:75A-1.1 et seq., and N.J.A.C. 5:75A-2.2 specifically requires each municipality or fire district to adopt a local fire mutual aid plan; and.

WHEREAS, the Township of Green recognizes that entering into an agreement for mutual aid and assistance with the County of Sussex to protect against loss, damage or destruction by fire, catastrophe, civil unrest, major emergency or other extraordinary devastation and to address those situations when additional aid and assistance is necessary.
