MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK: Mr. Zschack noted the following matters:

Health Insurance Increase - The Township allows employees to choose from five (5) State Health Benefit plans. The average increase of these five (5) plans is 6.74%. Due to changes in employment and benefits chosen, this year's health insurance cost is reduced by approximately \$4,000.00.

2023 Statewide Insurance Grant - It is with pleasure that I announce a \$1,250.00 grant from Statewide Insurance Fund for general safety and risk management control. These monies will be utilized to purchase road safety equipment.

NJFW Fisher Cat Camera Trapping Study - Kaitlyn Barone, New Jersey DEP Bureau of Wildlife Management has requested using EverGreen Park as a data collection site to conduct research on fishers in New Jersey. Sightings of these animals have increased in northern New Jersey over the past several years, and New Jersey Fish and Wildlife is in the process of collecting more information on their numbers and distribution. This study utilizes a trail camera to capture videos of fishers at baited locations, using sardines and scent lures as attractants. This protocol is in no way harmful to wildlife and does not interfere with their natural behaviors. The site will be visited by Fish and Wildlife personnel or designated volunteers once every two weeks to refresh the bait and check cameras. The cameras would be set out the week of January 7, 2024, and retrieved the week of April 1, 2024. If there are no objections, we will allow said study. The Committee discussed concerns on the location and attracting animals, particularly bears, to the bait so close to neighbors

and prefer a more secluded area in the park. The Township Clerk will relay the Committee's concerns to the NJDEP.

MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY: Mayor Phillips referred to Rose's question at the last meeting regarding the Subcommittee assignments. Mayor Phillips explained that historically the subcommittees are appointments assigned by the Mayor. Generally, matters are brought to the full Committee and then filtered to the subcommittees when appropriate. After the discussion that followed, it was agreed upon that the 2024 Mayor will consider adjusting the assignments to better utilize the subcommittees.

Mayor Phillips thanked the Recreation Committee for a fantastic tree lighting. Having the 7th and 8th Grade involved was a nice change.

Mayor Phillips commented on the water drainage issue in the parking lot at the park. The Township Clerk explained what was done in the past to help the condition and what is planned for the future project to rectify the drainage situation.

Mayor Phillips asked if there has been an update from Elizabethtown Gas with regards to running the gas line up to the school during the break. The Township Clerk will follow-up with Elizabethtown Gas.

Qarmout had no report.

Raffay commented that the gate at EverGreen Park was open late Saturday evening.

RESOLUTION 2023-177 TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE - TOWNSHIP OF GREEN COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NI

ADOPTING A REVISION TO THE TOWNSHIP OF GREEN EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

WHEREAS, the Township of Green adopted Ordinance 2014-04 on April 28, 2014, adopting the "Township of Green Handbook Policies and Procedures" ("Handbook"), and providing that amendments and/or supplements to the Handbook may be made from time to time without notice and at the sole discretion of the Township Committee, which amendments and supplements shall be effective via Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has determined that amendments to the Handbook, specifically the Vacation (Page 4.8) and Sick Leave (Page 4.10) policies, are desired to be implemented from the date of adoption of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, that the Township of Green Handbook shall be and is hereby revised and in effect from the date of adoption of this Resolution, as follows:

1. The "Vacation" policy shall be revised to read as follows:

VACATION

Unless otherwise provided for in writing, full-time employees' vacation is an accrued benefit based on the following schedule:

For full-time salaried or full-time hourly employees vacation is a benefit based on the following schedule:

- New employees shall receive one working day of vacation upon completion of the initial month of employment if they begin work on the 1st through the 8th day of the calendar month, and one-half working day if they begin on the 9th through the 23rd day of the month.
- After the initial month of employment and up to the end of the first calendar year, employees shall receive one working day of vacation upon completion of or each month of service. (These days may be taken after the completion of three months service and then as earned. Anticipated earned vacation days may not be taken unless approved by the Administrator.)

RESOLUTION 2023-177 TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE - TOWNSHIP OF GREEN COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NI

- From the beginning of the first full calendar year of employment and up to five full years of continuous service, 12 working days, accrued at the rate of one working day of vacation upon completion of each month of service.
- After five years of continuous service and up to 12 full years of continuous service, 15 working days, accrued at the rate of one and one-quarter (1.25) working days of vacation upon completion of each month of service.
- After 12 years of service and up to 20 full years of continuous service,
 20 working days, accrued at the rate of one and two-thirds (1.66)
 working days of vacation upon completion of each month of service.
- Over 20 full years of continuous service, 25 working days, accrued at the rate of one and two and one-tenth (2.1) working days of vacation upon completion of each month of service.

The increase in vacation leave shall be granted at the beginning of the calendar year <u>after</u> which the years of service requirement will be met.

Employees must receive their Supervisor's approval at least ten (10) days in advance of the first vacation day. Vacations must be taken during the current calendar year unless the Administrator determines that it cannot be taken because of business demands, in which case, Employees who do not use all of their vacation allowance may "carry over" a maximum of 25% of their yearly allotted vacation up to April 30th of the next year, upon approval of the Administrator only, and thereafter any unused vacation time shall be forfeited.

Although employees are credited with the full years' vacation at the beginning of each calendar year, it is done so with the expectation that the employee will remain in the Township's employ during the entire year. In the event an employee leaves the Township's employ for any reason, any vacation leave used in excess of that which is accrued (earned) up to that time must be repaid to the Township. Likewise, any remaining accrued vacation leave upon termination of employment shall be paid to the employee at their regular rate of pay.

Part-time salaried employees and part-time hourly employees with regular scheduled hours each week are eligible for paid vacation time in accordance with the above schedule except the time will be prorated based on the average number of <u>scheduled</u> work hours.

2. The "Sick Leave" policy shall be revised to read as follows:

SICK LEAVE

While Green Township requires good attendance of all employees, the Township also recognizes the reality that employees may become ill and unable to report for work.

During the first year or partial year worked all full-time employees shall be entitled to one day of sick leave for each full month worked. An employee with one or more years of service shall be entitled to fifteen (15) days of sick leave per year.

Part time employees with regularly scheduled hours each week are entitled to sick leave as described above and in accordance with the rules above except that the time shall be prorated based upon the number of hours worked in a week.

If an employee is absent because of illness, the Supervisor or Administrator must be notified directly, as soon as possible. Failure to call in to the Supervisor or Administrator promptly will be considered a violation of responsibility and may subject an employee to disciplinary action up to and including termination.

If an employee is absent for three (3) or more scheduled working days, the employee must submit a signed physician's statement identifying the reason for the absence promptly to the Township. After an illness of three (3) consecutive scheduled working days, a signed physician's statement is required prior to any return to work. In cases of illness which require an extended or excessive use of sick leave, the Township has the option of requesting an examination by a Township-retained physician, at the cost of the Township, or requiring an employee to submit a doctor's statement explaining the employee's health status and probable duration of illness or injury.

Sick leave shall be granted to employees at the beginning of the calendar year. At the end of each calendar year, an employee's unused sick time is added to the allotment for the following year. Employees hired on or after May 21, 2010 shall receive no sick time payout upon resignation. No employees, regardless of date of hire, shall receive supplemental compensation for accumulated unused sick leave in an amount in excess of \$15,000.00, and any supplemental compensation shall be payable only at the time of retirement.

Employees who are ill and have exhausted their accrued sick leave will not be paid for those days absent, unless they seek to utilize other forms of paid leave, such as vacation or personal days. Employees who are found to be abusing their sick leave shall be subject to discipline, up to and including termination.

RESOLUTION 2023-177 TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE - TOWNSHIP OF GREEN COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NJ

Employees shall not abuse sick leave, and any improper use of sick leave, including any inappropriate patterns, may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination. An inappropriate pattern includes sick time taken more than once a year before or after vacation and holidays. Further, excessive time taken off for sick leave before and/or after weekends constitutes an inappropriate pattern of use of sick leave.
