- If the brush pile contains metal of any kind, it will be rejected, this includes nails.
- Each road will be canvassed only ONE TIME.
- Chips may be obtained at Wesley Field and Papa Park (when available).

Tree Seedlings - Tree seedlings will be available at the municipal building from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday April 22. This has been a popular program in the past with most seedling picked up by the public.

Clean Communities Day - is scheduled for Saturday, April 29, 2023, 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., tire recycling services will be available at the DPW Complex. Paper shredding will also be available from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Volunteer organizations will also remove litter along roadways, parks and trails.

Environmental Committee Resignation - A member of the Environmental Committee has submitted their resignation.

Local Recreation Improvement Grant - The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs' (DCA) has announced the award of \$25 million in Local Recreation Improvement Grants to counties, municipalities, and school districts across New Jersey to ensure public access to quality outdoor space and recreational facilities. The grants were awarded to 352 local governments after a competitive application process. We are pleased to announce that a \$14,950 grant was awarded to Green Township for outdoor movie equipment. Kudos go out to all involved.

Stormwater Infrastructure Mapping - Green Township has received the first installment of \$25,000.00 from the grant to supplement expenses in becoming a Tier A stormwater designation. These grant monies will be utilized to ensure proper mapping is achieved.

Recycling Grant - The recycling grant report has been submitted to SCMUA. They had some comments and corrections which will be completed and submitted back to SCMUA.

RESOLUTION ADJUSTING OVERTIME POLICY

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has decided to clarify and adjust the Overtime Policy, page 3.2 of the Employee Handbook Policies and Procedures, to further define compensatory time off and provide for overtime compensation for holidays.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, that the overtime policy of the Employee Handbook Policies and Procedures, page 3.2, shall be deleted and replaced in its entirety as follows:

OVERTIME

Under the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act, certain employees in managerial, supervisory, administrative, computer or professional positions are exempt from the provisions of the Act. Exempt employees are not eligible to receive overtime compensation and are required to work the normal workweek and any additional hours needed to fulfill their responsibilities.

Depending on work needs, non-exempt employees may be required to work overtime. Non-exempt employees are not permitted to work overtime unless the overtime is budgeted and approved by the Supervisor and/or the Administrator. The work week runs from 12:01 a.m. Monday through 11:59 p.m. on Sunday.

Non-exempt employees will receive overtime compensation for approved hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours per week at the rate of one and one-half times the regular rate of pay. Employees may choose overtime compensation in the form of overtime pay at their regular hourly salary or compensating time off. The maximum number of hours that an employee may accrue for future compensating time off is fifteen (15) hours (10 hours worked plus five hours for time and one half). Once this maximum has been accumulated, all additional hours will be compensated by overtime pay. Accrued and taken overtime compensating hours must be noted on the employee's time sheet.

RESOLUTION 2023-87 TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE - TOWNSHIP OF GREEN COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NJ

If a non-exempt employee works on Sunday, the employee will receive additional compensation (pay or compensatory time) in the form of two (2) hours for each hour worked,

less the number of hours of overtime compensation received under any other provision of the policy. If a non-exempt employee works on a recognized holiday or paid holiday, the employee will receive additional compensation (pay or compensatory time) in the form of three (3) hours for each hour worked, in addition to any other compensation received under any other provision of the policy. For example, if Christmas (a recognized holiday) falls on a Sunday, and Monday is the paid Township holiday, non-exempt employees who work on the Christmas Sunday and/or the Township-paid holiday Monday are eligible for additional compensation (pay or compensatory time) in the form of three (3) hours for each hour worked on both Sunday and Monday.

If a non-exempt employee is required to return to work in an emergency or because of unusual circumstance other than for a snow/ice event, the employee will receive overtime compensation (pay or compensatory time) of the greater a) three (3) hours; or b) the actual number of hours worked.

Employees must make a request to their supervisor at least two (2) days in advance when they want to take compensating time off. The Supervisor will approve the request if the absence does not cause undue hardship to the department. Compensating time off must be used within ninety (90) days of accrual. Carryover compensatory time off from one calendar year to the next may not exceed eight (8) hours.

TOWNSHIP OF GREEN, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NJ

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9-9, MAINTENANCE AND USE OF FACILITIES, TO INCLUDE A NEW SUBSECTION (e) PROHIBITING ANY FLYING OBJECTS AT ALL TOWNSHIP FACILITIES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Green that Section 9-9 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Green is hereby amended to add a new subsection (e) prohibiting any flying objects at all Township facilities as follows:

SECTION 1.

Section 9-9, Maintenance and Use of Facilities, shall be revised by addition of a new subparagraph (e) as follows:

e. No flying objects, including but not limited to drones, remote control objects, ultralight vehicles and/or paragliders, are permitted at any Township facility. See also Chapter 19, Drones.

SECTION 2 - SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3 - REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are inconsistent or in opposition to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with law.
