APRIL 11, 2016**

**CALL TO ORDER**

The April 11, 2016, meeting of the Green Township Committee was called to order at 6:32 p.m.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

**ADEQUATE NOTICE:** Mrs. Peralta read the statement of adequate notice.

**ROLL CALL:** Present: Mr. Chirip, Mr. Conkling, Mr. Kurzeja, Mrs. Phillips and Mr. Qarmout

Also present: Mrs. Linda Peralta, Clerk/Administrator; Mr. Richard Stein, Township Attorney; Mr. Watson Perigo, Municipal Department Head; and Mrs. Patty DeClesis, Deputy Clerk

**WORKSHOP DISCUSSIONS:**

- a. **Active Employees - Employee Health Care Contribution** – Mrs. Peralta referred to her memo dated March 28, 2016, outlining active employees and their current health care benefits and post-retirement benefits as well as a chart containing the formula used to determine the contribution employees make toward their health benefits. The Committee continued their discussion from the previous meeting. Mrs. Peralta is not recommending a change at this time. The Committee agreed.

**Retired Employees - State Health Benefit – Employer Payment of Post-Retirement Medical Costs** - Mrs. Peralta explained that for active employee health benefits currently those employees hired prior to April 2, 2008, are eligible for family health benefits. Also prior employees were eligible for family health benefits if they were elected or appointed employees. This remains in effect today. On April 2, 2008, the Township Committee changed the policy so that only full time employees were eligible for health benefits and only for the employee. The employee would have to be employed with Green Township for 25 years and then would be eligible for 100% of their health care covered by the town and 100% of their Medicare cost covered by the town. There are employees that are or will be eligible to retire over the next several years and therefore will need to be replaced. The Township may not be able to draw the appropriate kind of employee to replace those people when they are only offering health benefits for the employee and not for the family. This could change the post retirement benefit as well. Mrs. Peralta suggested that employees hired from such a date forward, full family benefits would be offered while they are employed. In retirement, the Township would only cover a portion, for example 50% of their health benefits. In effect, this would make three classes of employees: those hired prior to April 2, 2008, those hired between April 2, 2008 and today, and those hired after today. Mrs. Peralta and Mr. Stein will prepare a draft resolution.

**The regularly scheduled meeting began at 7:00 p.m.**

**OLD BUSINESS:**

- a. **Resolution 2016-59 – 2016 Budget - Public Hearing and Adoption**

Mayor Phillips stated that on March 14, 2016, the Committee approved the budget for this year with a zero percent increase for the 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Mr. Chirip motioned to open the meeting for public comment, seconded by Mr. Conkling.

There being no public comments, Mr. Chirip motioned to close public hearing and adopt the 2016 budget.

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**DISCUSSIONS:**

- a. **Fire Department – Update** – Mayor Phillips explained that a joint meeting was recently held with Mrs. Peralta, Mayor Phillips, Mr. Chirip, Frelinghuysen Township and the Green Township Volunteer Fire Department. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the fire department’s budget and ideas to raise funds to meet their budget obligations. Frelinghuysen introduced an ordinance (Cash for Crash) that would enable the Fire Department to bill for certain fees when they respond to motor vehicle accidents. The fees would not pertain to calls received from residents’ homes. Mayor Phillips explained the idea for this came up for consideration as a way to look for possible revenues for the fire department. Mr. Chirip stated they reviewed the budget spreadsheet and capital expenditures. The fire department will provide a list of capital priorities and operating expenses. It was suggested an Inter-Local Service Agreement between Green Township, Frelinghuysen Township and the Fire Department to have better communication and control of the finances.
- b. **Use of Fields (open, close, restricted use) and Fees for Use** – Mrs. Peralta stated that the baseball fields were opened last week. The soccer fields remained closed until April 15, 2016. Mrs. Peralta spoke with Mr. Mike Viersma regarding use of the fields. Mr. Viersma recommends limiting the play on the fields. The Committee agreed and suggested limiting to only recreational soccer. The fields should be reevaluated in the summer for the fall months. Mr. Viersma further suggests to think about the advanced mechanical treatment this fall and the clay management this spring. Quotations for clay management can be obtained if the cost is under \$17,500.00.

Mr. Dave Young with Lackawanna Little League Recreation Baseball, 38 Summit Road, submitted an application to use Wesley Field and has requested the usage fees be waived. Mr. Young understands the new ordinance and the usage fees, however, the League did not include the field usage fees in the registration fees. Currently, Lackawanna Little League is the only recreational baseball league that Green Township children can play in. After a discussion, Mr. Kurzeja stated that since Lackawanna Little League has been in town for a long time and since Green Township kids can only play in this recreational league, he approves waiving the fees for the spring season through the end of June. It was suggested the League reapply for the summer months if applicable.

The Conservancy along with the Sussex County Open Space Committee met with every town in Sussex County, documented and prepared the Open Space and Recreation Plan Update. Mr. Caruso presented the updated. The Committee thanked Mr. Caruso.

**Resolution 2016-63 – Appointments to the Recreation Advisory Committee, Environmental Advisory Committee and the Open Space Advisory Committee** – Mayor Phillips stated that the Personnel Sub-Committee recently interviewed the three candidates and recommend their appointments as follows: Ms. Danielle Conklin to the Recreation Advisory Committee, Mr. Richard Conklin to the Open Space Advisory Committee and Mr. Michael Muller to the Environmental Advisory Committee.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Mrs. Peralta noted the following:

- Letter from Jeffrey Surenian, Esq. requesting contribution of \$2,000.00 for the consortium. Mr. Stein explained that the State had refused to move on COAH so the court took it over. Judicial certification of the plan was needed which required a major statistical study of the entire state by qualified academicians. A defense group was put together and several hundred municipalities in New Jersey shared the expense. Green Township’s initial contribution was \$2,000.00 for the base data. Ms. Ursula Leo has submitted a petition to the court for approval. If it is approved, it will then come to our Planning Board to begin the adoption process. The fair share people have come up with their own numbers. This additional \$2,000.00 that the joint defense group is looking for is to finish the study and to rebut the fair share numbers. All towns in the consortium have been asked for this contribution.

**MATTERS FROM THE GOVERNING BODY:** Mr. Conkling asked for an update on 231 Pequest Road. Mrs. Peralta noted a memo from the Zoning Officer, Mr. Diehl. Mr. Diehl met with the property owner on site on April 1<sup>st</sup> to phase out the cleanup of debris on and around the property. Mr. Diehl has conducted other site visits and will conduct another one on April 15, 2016. Mr. Diehl is attempting to work with the property owner.

Mr. Kurzeja noted that they began taking down the old barn on Kennedy Road. Mr. Kurzeja feels that the Park Ordinance served its purpose tonight.

- Status of Old Firehouse – Last year the Committee adopted a resolution approving the replacement of the retaining walls. The project has been on hold for various reasons. Before moving forward, Mrs. Peralta asked the Committee to think about the project. The cost to replace the retaining walls is \$15,000.00. In addition, a parking lot needs to be installed, all of the electricity in the building needs to be replaced, the bathroom and the oil furnace heating system needs to be replaced. The estimated cost is \$120-\$150,000.00. An alternative is to take down the building, level out the drive in the front, expand Fireman’s Field, put in a parking lot to the left of the property a trailer or modular unit that would house the post office. The structure would be ADA compliant. It is anticipated that eventually the post office will close its doors. The modular unit can then be used as a small community center or meeting place for the community. If a trailer is used, that can be removed. Another alternative is to sell the post office building.

Mayor Phillips motioned to explore options to demo the old firehouse.

Discussion: Mr. Chirip added that the pad at the current fire house be looked at as it is need of repair. Mrs. Peralta has asked the Township Engineer for an estimate to draw up a plan.

- Youth Serving Volunteer/Employee Background Checks – Mrs. Peralta explained that the Committee adopted a resolution at the February 8, 2016, meeting authorizing reimbursement for background checks for those individuals working with youth organizations affiliated with the Township or Green Township Sporting Club (GTSC). Mrs. Peralta discovered that the State Police no longer do background checks. The State Police have arranged background checks to be done by Morpho Trust in Sparta. There are three ways that backgrounds checks can be done. One way is the volunteer would get fingerprinted and get their results. If there is a criminal record, the full criminal history would be disclosed in the results. This may

put the staff and the Committee in a position of determining what criminal acts are or are not acceptable in conjunction with working with youth. The Township would also need to maintain a database and track all of the background checks. The cost is \$40.70 per background check. A second method is the Township could sign a memorandum of understanding with the State Police for their Volunteer Review Operation (VRO). The Township would be named as receiving the results and the results would only be an approval or a denial, not the criminal record. The Township would still receive the results and denial would still have to be dealt with and a database would be maintained. The cost is \$55.45 per background check for employees. This would include the Summer Recreational Program. \$24.20 per background check for volunteers. A third option is the same as the second method, however instead of the Township receiving the results, a third party can be named. An organization, Instant Verification, would receive the results and maintain a list of approved employees/volunteers on their website. If there was a denial, they would contact the person and deal with the process. Mrs. Peralta distributed the agreement used by Instant Verification, Inc. Mr. Stein reviewed and approved the agreement. Mr. Kurzeja stated that option 3 seems least erroneous and most ominous. The Committee agreed.

- Mrs. Peralta stated that in the past the State was doing inspections of all the bridges in Sussex County. KS Engineering inspected the Lake Tranquility bridge and has a few comments that need to be addressed. Mr. John Miller, Township Engineer, and Mr. Perigo inspected the bridge to clarify the recommendation that the metal parts underneath the bridge be coated. Mr. Miller has drafted a letter to KS Engineering for the Committee's review. Mr. Chirip commented that the bridge was designed so that the coating was to naturally oxidize and be maintenance free. Mr. Stein will review the files to see if there is an extended guarantee on the steel coatings.

**MATTERS FROM THE TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY:** Mr. Stein stated that there is a state statute that allows municipalities to adopt ordinances to put a hold on insurance proceeds paid to a homeowner if they have a fire at their home. The homeowner can get \$2,500.00, however anything above that is frozen until the municipality confirms whether or not there is a lien on the property. Currently there is a situation where a town had to bring in a heavy piece of equipment to demolish the remaining structure after a fire for safety reasons. The question is who pays for that. If an ordinance has been adopted, it will assert that as a lien against the property.

**MATTERS FROM THE MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENT HEADS:** No matters from Mr. Perigo.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS AND/OR QUESTIONS:** There were no public comments.


This is Resolution ES 2016-01.


